# 4. CASL Item — Update

- Sab and Mary met with Tricia who chairs the Curriculum Committee and Julie and Alicia, who are
  involved in the work of Program Mapping. Patrick also attended and provided responses for the many
  questions. Sab and Mary will work on a new course document that will include curriculum mapping
  information in the new course revision. The terms program mapper and curriculum mapping were
  confusing.
- Mary and Sab have submitted the Annual Report on CASL (including ePortfolios) work to the Academic Senate. The summaries can be found on the Academic Senate webpage
- Sab and Mary will present to the new curricular coordinators on May 19, 2023. The new curricular coordinators will attend required raining sessions shortly after their position is confirmed.
- eLumen scoring via Canvas issue has been solved for outcomes assessments. The integration works, to
  use it faculty and coordinators would need to create a new assignment to then score the assessment in
  eLumen.

The IAC Assessment slides that Mary and Sab shared with the committee, are precise and clear. Simplifying the mapping scheme to exclude the different levels of mapping.: Introduce, Reinforce and Master, might be a good approach. The presentation document will be shared with department chairs and the different representatives of different divisions.
