2. A Roller Coaster of Legislative Priorities and Implications for Canyons Completes (Omar Torres – 15 minutes)

It sometimes feels as if we are living in what some might call a Full Throttle—characterized by speed enthusiasts as the number one tallest and fastest looping roller coaster in the world, found in our very own Six Flags Magic Mountain—with all the changes encountered across the California Community College system, as we proactively respond to changing statutes and regulations. In one week alone in March, several communications from the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office have been sent to help our colleges adapt to legislative reforms focused on AB 928, AB 1705, and AB 1187. In addition, our College has been selected to provide statewide Technical Assistance in support of the Zero Textbook (ZTC) grant program. So,

what is all this change about, and why should we be concerned about all of this when we are in the midst of updating our 2023-2026 Strategic Plan and preparing to update our Canyons Completes Action Plan?

The purpose of this item is to:

4. California Guided Pathways (CAGP) 2.0 Institute #4 Team Takeaways (20 minutes)

The purpose of this item is to provide highlights from the California Guided Pathways (CAGP) 2.0 Institute #4 held in March.

Institute Focus: Teaching and Learning as a Key Strategy to Ensure Equitable Student Outcomes

Institute Objectives:

- Establish an institution-wide commitment to equity-minded, asset-based teaching.
- Address obstacles for advancing racial equity in Guided Pathways design and explore its connection to teaching & learning.
- Identify strategies for building people capacity surrounding the teaching & learning function to achieve equity goals.
- Understand how and to what extent students experience teaching and learning at the college.
- Strengthen college work to incorporate effective teaching practice & student engagement throughout the student lifecycle at the college.
- Develop a college strategy for student engagement integrating experiential/applied learning and other active/collaborative learning approaches to enhance instruction and student success in courses across programs of study, focusing specifically on having colleges ensure that racially minoritized students experience these high-impact practices.
- Establish the importance of ongoing assessment of programmatic equity with disaggregated student outcome data.
- Promote development of program-level learning outcomes aligned with the requirements for success in employment and further education in a given field; apply results of learning outcomes assessment to improve instructional effectiveness.
- Describe the importance of the physiology of equity on student learning and formulate strategies for mitigating the negative effects of the physiology of equity.

5. CCCCO Guided Pathways Work Plan (Phase 2 Assurance) (Daylene Meuschke - 20 minutes)

At March 14th meeting, the committee received an update on the requirement for colleges to submit a Guided Pathways (GP) Work Plan by June 1 using the template provided by the CCCCO. The purpose of this agenda item is to provide an update on how the GP funding has supported Canyons Completes efforts and get the committee's input on where we should rate our progress for each of the ten GP areas identified in the CCCCO Guided Pathways Work Plan. Once the ratings are established, the committee and other campus groups can contribute to the associated open-ended prompts for each rating selected.
