Meeting Theme: Building Connection Opportunities to Support Student Success

The **overarching goal** for this meeting is to reflect on personal/departmental efforts that foster connections for students as well as identifying a plan for increasing support for first-generation students participating in Canyons Promise starting with the Fall 2024 cohort.

- Recap highlights and takeaways from the Enhancing and Redesigning the Student Experience: A Conversation with Our Students (student panel) at the October 10th meeting (Daylene Meuschke – 5 minutes).
- 3. Equity and Guided Pathways Next Level: (Guided Pathways Regional Coordinator, Brandy Thomas 15 minutes)

The purpose of this item is for our Guided Pathways Regional Coordinator to share insights from her GP work with colleges and provide ideas on how we can use an equity-focused, GP framework to advance our current efforts, locally branded as Canyons Completes.

The mission of the Institutional Effectiveness and Inclusive Excellence Steering Committee is to develop and articulate the institutional approach to fostering an equity-minded, learning-centered and inclusive community for all students, faculty and staff. To fulfill its mission the Institutional Effectiveness and Inclusive Excellence Steering Committee will facilitate streamlined processes, improve communication and improve collaboration through its regular, coordination of meetings between student government, academic senate, student equity and achievement,-basic skills, noncredit, Strong Workforce, and other groups as applicable (e.g., grant funded projects).

The purpose of this item is to discuss the pre-work for this meeting by identifying a) strengths and b) opportunities for growth as it relates to the following questions:

- How does my everyday work help foster students' connection to their pathway and the campus?
- How do I build relationships with students, colleagues or departments to help foster students' connection to their pathway and the campus?
- How does our institution help foster students' connection to their pathway and the campus?
- How do we infuse caring for our students, each other and ourselves into our Guided Pathways Framework?
- 5. **Designing Connection Opportunities for First-Generation Students Within Canyons Promise** (Framing by Jasmine Ruys-3 minutes; Breakout Room Instructions by Brandy Thomas 3-minutes; Breakout Room Discussion-20 minutes; Breakout Room Report Out-20 minutes)

The purpose of this item is to brainstorm how the committee and college can provide connection opportunities focused on our first-generation student population within the Canyons Promise program with the goal of developing an annual calendar of connection opportunities. This builds on part of the committee's Vision to "purposefully identify essential experiences for all students coupled with individualized support based on student needs". In addition, this item honors the committee's discussion at the May 2023 meeting to establish workgroups for new efforts and is aligned with the recommendations from the recent <u>Canyons Promise 5-Year evaluation</u>.
