This rubric was designed for the evaluation of solutions proposed through College of the Canyons' Integrated Plan process, which is operated through the Institutional Effectiveness and Inclusive Excellence committee. The person(s) requesting funds should use the rubric as a guideline when submitting a request for funds. The Basic Skills, Student Equity and SSSP categorical fund managers will review requests received through this process. Proposals will be ranked and funded in priority to the extent funding allows and in aligned with the goals delineated on the BSI/SSSP/Equity Integrated Plan. Requests with lower rankings will have an opportunity to resubmit in following years. Any suggestions to improve the rubric and/or solution form should be addressed to the (IE)² tri-chairs. Requestors may be asked to provide additional information, if needed, after the team reviews the request.
