Additional Notes:

- Administrative Unit Outcomes (AUOs) are measurable outcome statements of fundamental area/unit functions and resulting services/resources provided to students and those working with the area/unit.
- The college has an established history of regular, systematic outcomes assessment for courses, programs, and institutional outcomes. Each department identifies areas for assessment and through data analysis conducts assessment on services for students. These data allow departments to implement improvements in a timely way and support continuous improvement.
- The goal of AUOs is to support continuous improvement by producing actionable data that facilitates ongoing adjustments and improvements.
- The 5-step assessment model above helps identify and improve functions based on what students/recipients experience, receive, or understand as a result of area/unit services.
- AUOs should be aligned to the goals of the area, at the center or heart of department function, feasible to be accomplished, meaningful to the area, and measurable.
- Assessment is a key part of accreditation, is adaptable to specific area needs, occurs comprehensively throughout the college, leads to examination and improvement of processes and services, continues to inform college planning and overall learning.
- The college regularly evaluates the quality of student support systems through program review and AUO assessment and the college annually reviews AUOs through program review.
