As we round out the year and approach the end of 2020 we arrive at my favorite part of the year. No, not Black Friday, but bulk season! As much as I can't wait for my mom's turkey sandwiches this year, most of us are looking for that proper gift that puts a smile on the faces of tech lovers in our families. The following is a slimmed-down list of gadgets that range from light in the wallet to just under \$150.

## Under \$39

If you're looking for some great tech without breaking the bank, the Echo Dot and portable battery banks are always a solid option. If you have a family that has grown a need to ask Google for help answering a question or need to keep devices charged on road trips just long enough to make it to the end of a Zoom session, there's plenty to choose from. The Amazon Echo Dot is a space-friendly smart speaker that has now reached sub \$40 prices.

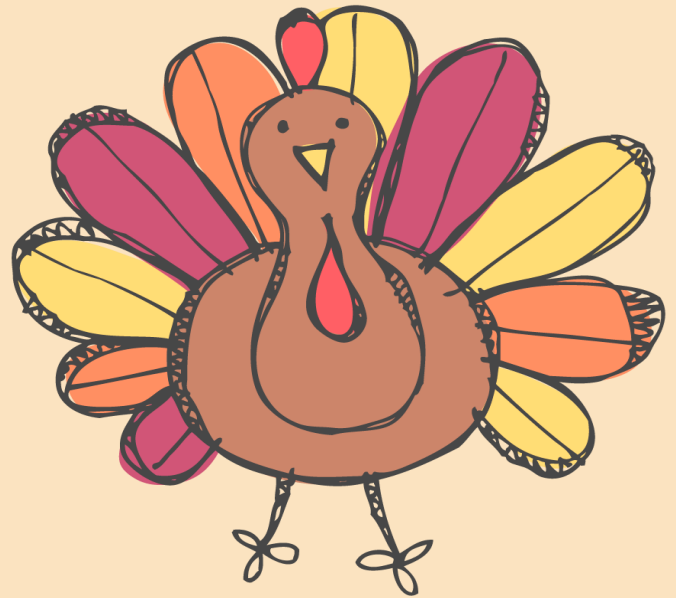
My suggestion for portable battery banks is choosing one with different charging options. Not all devices can handle ultra-fast charging, which can be damaging to battery life.

It touts 20 hours of playtime and the ability to connect to three devices at once.

While Apple's AirPods Pro set a new standard for quality, they might not fit into everyone's budget. If you are interested in a pair of earbuds with noise-canceling, your budget will define the quality. For entry-level noise-canceling earbuds, the team over at

# THE IMPOSTERS ARE AMONG US!

We continue to see attackers set up email addresses to impersonate College of the Canyons employees in order to victimize you.

Typically, these attackers will initially ask you for your mobile number so that they can send you a text. Then they will make up some story about how they desperately need your help by having you go and buy gift cards on behalf of the impersonated individual. They will ask you for the redemption codes off the back of the gift cards and will assure you that they will repay you when they next see you.

At this point, the scam is complete. The gift card value will be redeemed remotely and the impersonated individual will have no idea what you are talking about when you ask for the money.

To avoid these types of attacks:

- Always check the sender's email address very carefully.
  - If you think you are communicating with someone from College of the Canyons and they are not using an @canyons.edu address, you should be highly suspicious.
- If the requests for your action or information sound unusual or strange, attempt to contact the individual by phone and verify them by their voice, if you are familiar with it.
- If you feel unsure of the situation, this is also a red flag that something is wrong.

## ENTERPRISE SYSTEMS UPDATES

### Zoom Sub-Account

Enterprise Systems will be responsible for provisioning and maintaining Zoom accounts for the district beginning Dec. 17.

The team will work with CCC TechConnect to move all our Zoom accounts to our very own sub-account. This move will include your recordings and will have a forward for your old meeting ID to your new one. Canvas users will also be able to take advantage of the new TechConnect integration, which will replace the ConferZoom integration.

The TechConnect Canvas integration has an improved user interface and better compatibility with Zoom and Canvas. Finally, you will use CanyonsID when signing into Zoom.

Online Education will provide training on how to use the new integration for interested faculty.

### OnBase Financial Aid
