Students who place at a higher level may take courses from a lower level (e.g. If you are in level '2' you can also take courses from level '1', etc.). If a student is in a lower level and wishes to take courses from a higher level, they will first need to complete the appropriate course. Courses that lead to higher-level courses are connected by the arrows.
