

General Education Requirements Unique to Paralegal Studies (2023-2024) – Complete a minimum of 21 semester units of general education including at least one course in each of the following areas. A given course meets the requirements in only one area. **However, courses with asterisks (*) may be used to meet a General Education requirement listed in A-E below as well as the COC Diversity Requirement.**

PLEASE ALSO NOTE THAT STUDENTS MAY ELECT TO COMPLETE THE IGETC OR THE CSU GENERAL EDUCATION PATTERNS IN LIEU OF A-E BELOW.

In addition, students need to complete the local COC Diversity, PE/Wellness, and Mathematics Competency requirements, earn 60 units, a C grade in each Paralegal major course requirements, an overall degree applicable GPA of 2.0 plus be in “good standing” at College of the Canyons in order to earn the Associate Degree. (Please check in with the COC Counseling office to make sure these requirements are all being satisfied.)

E. American Institutions – Minimum of 3 semester or 4 quarter units required that cover US-1: Historical development of American institutions & ideas, US-2: US Constitution and US-3: State & Local Government.

At COC to meet this, you must pick 2 courses from the following, by completing either Option 1 OR Option 2:

Option 1: One course from: Economics 170, 170H, History 111, 111H, 112, 112H, 116*, 117*, 120*, 120H*, or 130* **AND** Political Science 150 or 150H

Option 2: Complete **both** History 111 or 111H **AND** History 112 or 112H to meet this requirement

NOTE about Major Course Substitutions for Paralegal courses taken at other colleges:

College of the Canyons does not accept legal specialty courses from a school that is not ABA approved or accredited by a College of the Canyons approved accrediting body. College of the Canyons limits the transfer of legal specialty units (i.e. Paralegal courses) to 12 semester or 18 quarter units from an ABA approved program. College of the Canyons allows 9 semester or 13.5 quarter units of legal specialty units (i.e. paralegal courses) from a non-ABA approved program. ALL additional units should transfer for elective credit, but the limits stated above are for substitution of paralegal courses. Therefore, it is likely that if you have taken many courses at another institution, you will be limited on the number of courses that transfer and substitute for paralegal courses. In addition, the courses transferring will be examined for rigor, subject matter, delivery modality (lecture, hybrid, etc.), topics covered, assignments and/or projects. Merely having the same course name is insufficient.
