What is Biological Science?

Biological Sciences covers all aspects of the scientific study of life and emphasizes both the unity and diversity of living things. Their work increases our understanding about the natural world in which we live and helps us address issues of personal well being and worldwide concern, such as environmental depletion, threats to human health, and maintaining viable and abundant food supplies. The structure, function, and behavior of organisms are studied at the molecular, cellular, organismal and environmental levels. The Biology program at COC serves three areas of a broad background of studies for the biology major preparing for transfer to a four-year institution; support courses in human anatomy, human physiology, and general microbiology; and courses in natural sciences to fulfill general education requirements.
