What is Medical Lab Technician?

A medical laboratory technician (MLT) is an important part of the health care team, specifically the clinical laboratory. They perform specimen collection (phlebotomy) from patients and analyze patient samples as requested by the patient's healthcare provider. MLTs work under the supervision of the Clinical Laboratory Scientist (CLS) to perform moderate complexity testing on patient samples. MLTs are trained to maintain, operate, and troubleshoot automated medical instrumentation and equipment.

The Medical Laboratory Technology Associate Degree program at COC prepares students for employment in clinical laboratories, industry and biotechnology. The MLT Program curriculum, an integration of classroom lectures, student laboratories and clinical training, fosters development of analytical and problem solving skills required in this profession. Once admitted to the MLT Program students are required to complete lab experiences at affiliated hospitals and clinical labs. Currently, there is approximately between 10-20% vacancy rate statewide.
