

College to Career Connection Nursing (RN, LVN to RN) / CNA

What is Nursing?

Registered Nurses use a scientific process to plan care for people in acute illnesses and teach them how to stay healthy or cope with their illness. They may give medicine, treatments, tests, injections, or draw blood as prescribed by the Physician. The two-year registered nursing program at College of the Canyons is designed to prepare the student with the knowledge required to assume the responsibilities of an entry level registered nurse. Upon graduation the student receives an Associate Degree in Nursing and is eligible to take the national licensure examination to become a registered nurse. COC has many RN-BSN Concurrent Enrollment Options occurring with various Universities (CSUN, CSULA, CSUDH, National University, & Concordia University, Irvine)-see COC Nursing website for details.

The LVN to RN "Career Ladder" program at COC is designed to provide an LVN with the education required to qualify for licensure as an RN.

COC Associate Degree in Nursing (RN) Checklist- will not transfer to a 4 year institution

A Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) helps patients or clients with healthcare needs under the supervision of a Registered Nurse (RN) or a Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN). Upon completion of this course and a state test for certification, the student will be able to function as a certified nurse assistant in a skilled nursing facility providing basic patient care for residents. The CNA works under the supervision of a licensed vocational nurse or registered nurse.

<u>CNA - Certified Nursing Assistant Certificate of Specialization</u> - will not transfer to a 4 year institution
