CAREER CERTIFICATES

ASSOCIATE DEGREES

- Over 105 Associate Degrees
 - Associate in Arts (AA)
 - Associate in Science (AS)
 - AA-T/AS-T CSU Transfer Associate Degrees
- · Requires a minimum of 60 degree applicable units
 - General Education + Major + Electives
- Leads to employment and/or transfer

TRANSFER PREPARATION

- Preparation for a Bachelor's Degree
- Requires a minimum of 60 transferable lower division units for CSU & UC systems
 - General Education + Major Preparation + Electives
- General Educational Certification pattern:
 - California General Education Transfer Curriculum (Cal-GETC). A single, standardized curriculum for California Community College (CCC) students to fulfill the lower-division general education (GE) requirements for transfer to the CSU and UC systems, effective Fall 2025.
- Leads to admission to a four-year college/university

BACHELOR DEGREE

- Bachelor of Science in Building Performance (BSBP)
 - Focuses on improving the measurable ways a building can be resource efficient (energy, water, waste) in addition to improving environmental quality for building occupants.

PROGRAMS TO SUPPORT THE TRANSFER STUDENT

ASSOCIATE IN ARTS OR ASSOCIATE IN SCIENCE IN TRANSFER (AA-T OR AS-T) - ICANGOTOCOLLEGE.COM

This transfer program from the California Community Colleges and the California State Universities makes it easier for students to transfer between the two school systems. Community college students who complete a AA-T or AS-T will be guaranteed admission to the California State University (CSU) system. With this degree, you have the opportunity to complete two degrees with only 120 units if you apply and are admitted into a similar degree program. Students with an AA-T or AS-T enter the CSU system with junior standing and need only 60 more semester units (or 90 quarter units) to complete a bachelor's degree.

TRANSFER SUCCESS PATHWAY PROGRAM (TSP) - CSU.EDU

The Transfer Success Pathway (TSP) program is designed to increase access to any of the CSU's 23 universities. To qualify, students must complete transfer requirements within three years, specify the university and major at the time they enter the agreement, and meet the transfer requirements set by the university.

Students planning to transfer to UCLA may qualify for the Transfer Alliance Program (TAP). TAP offers priority admission consideration to students who complete the Honors Program at College of the Canyons and apply to majors within UCLA's College of Letters and Science. TAP students also gain access to exclusive scholarships and academic support.
